Vasanth Panchami

Chanting the Vidya Mantra for students... Oh, Goddess Saraswathi, Fair as the white satin splash of jasmines, white as the celestial moon and light as the downy flakes We glorify thee, Oh Olympian Goddess gilded in silver, playing the divine veena; Thou art nestled on the snow capped lotus, and sway to the majestic waters.

Automating National Song, National Anthem and College bell - Rahul Mahadevan, IT-II

The college radio, where all announcements are given, including playing the National Song 'Vandematharam' in the morning and the National Anthem 'Jana Gana Mana' in the evening was done manually. Iam a student of IT Department and believe that humans may skip work or work with less efficiency where as computers never complain and always fulfil the job given to them. Therefore, I wrote a simple C++ program to assign the task of playing National Song and National Anthem to the computer in the RJ room.

I knew that the computer in the RJ room has internet connection and hence it maintains the right time even if the system is booted multiple times. I accessed system running time using a library in C++ called <ctime.h>. After accessing time in the code, it was just a series of if- and else if- statements which basically checks what time it is. The audio is played by a function called playSound() (one of the parameters is the path of the file) placed inside the 'if' statements where ever required.



The computer has to be switched ON all the time during college hours and just playing th song in the morning and evening does not put it to optimal use. Hence I added few more if- conditions and set a bell to ring every hour. This application was launched by our Director, Srikanth Jatla on 26th January, 2018. Initially, it was my duty to play the songs, and it was not always possible for me to do it, that's when I realised that it could be automated by a simple program. That's how the idea started.

Republic Day Celebrations

Republic Day was celebrated to commemorate the date on which the Constitution of India came into effect on 26 January 1950 as the governing document of India. The Constitution was adopted by the Indian Constituent Assembly on 26 November 1949 and came into existence on 26 January 1950 under a democratic government system. The country's transition under British Regime came to an end making our nation an independent republic. 26 January was chosen as the Republic day because it was on this day in 1930 when the Indian National Congress proclaimed declaration of Indian Independence (Purna Swaraj) as opposed to the English Dominion status.

ATRI celebrated the 69th Republic with great enthusiasm. The Director Prof Srikanth Jatla unfurled the Indian flag in the presence of faculty, staff, friends, and children. The NSS cadets and the members of sports club did the ceremonial March Past. The Director Mr Srikanth Jatla spoke on the fundamental rights and obligations of all citizens of India to help promote a spirit of patriotism and to uphold the unity of India.

He said it should be the concern of every individual especially the teaching fraternity to guide young students towards the responsibilities to the nation and in character building so that we live in peace and harmony in the midst of the global changes. To add to the patriotic fervor Little Ms. Asritha, daughter of Ms. B.Malathi, CSE faculty, presented a song.

Dr. Sandhya quoted Tagore's poem 'Where the mind is without fear' and urged the students to refrain from doing selfie stunts and spare their dear parents from anxiety. The Director announced two significant achievements made by our students.






associations, government bodies and academia to ensure that the benefits of IT advancement ultimately percolate down to every single citizen of India.

NSS ACTIVITIES

SURVEY IN THE ADOPTED VILLAGE QUTHUBULLAPUR

ATRI NSS unit cell conducted a survey in the village Quthubullapur on 6-Jan-2018. Around 50 NSS volunteers and NSS P. O D. Venugopal Reddy also participated in the survey . At 10:20 we reached the village. We had a short introduction program with the village sarpanch. Later we divided ourselves into teams and each volunteer was given survey forms. Coordinators explained regarding survey forms and gave individual route map to the teams. The survey was completed by 1:30pm.

- Problems identified in the village:
- Many old people were suffering with eyesight and retina.
- Mosquito menance in the area due to flow of waste water.
- There is no transport facility for the village.
- Hospitals are not available in the village.
- No proper bathrooms in the schools.

Upcoming event:

- For eyesight and retina problems we are planning to conduct an eye camp in February in collaboration with 'Vasan Eye Care'.
- NSS works on the premise that it is possible to awaken the villagers and slum dwellers to their responsibilities and develop in them the confidence to tackle their common problems with energy, enthusiasm and in a co-operative spirit, based on mutual aid and self-reliance. The role of students is limited as activists, enablers, catalytic agents with wider communities and as programme aids.

VILLAGE CAMP AT ANKIREDDY GUDEM

MOTTO of NSS "NOT ME, BUT YOU" reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless service and appreciation of the other person's point of view and also to show consideration for fellow human beings. It underlines that the







welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society on the whole. Therefore, it should be the aim of the NSS to demonstrate this motto in its day-to-day programmes.

Special Camping forms an integral part of National Service Scheme. It has special appeal to the youth as it provides unique opportunities to the students for group living, collective experience sharing and constant interaction with community.

The objective of this camp was to begin the interface with community, rapport building with community members and developing understanding of the village keeping in view of the rationale of village adoption i.e. develop long term institutional relation with the community and contribution to the upliftment of people therein as well as create awareness among volunteers regarding their responsibilities towards the society.

The volunteers participated enthusiastically in the camp conducted at Ankireddy Gudem , Choutuppal Mandal , Yadadri Bhongir District from 12-01-2018 to 18-01-2018 under the able supervision of NSS Programme officer Mr D .Venugopal Reddy.

The camp began with the inaugural function in the-village on12-1-2018 The function began with NSS song and then the programe officer explained the seven day programme schedule and the sarpanch of the village S.Mallesh Goud delivered the inaugural address.

The camp was planned for seven days where we had undertaken many socially and environmentally viable programmes which were very helpful to the people.

The journey of serving the society during the camp started with the inauguration where a total of 50 students were divided into 6 teams headed by final year students the teams started their job of surveying different houses in the village. A total of 400 houses were surveyed by the volunteers with the positive support of villagers. The volunteers noted down the main problems faced by the villagers

On day two, the teams were divided into two where one group of students were assigned the job of cleaning the premises of a school ,a temple and water tanks . This was followed by celebrations of Bhogi which entertained the villagers who gathered there.

On day three, the volunteers headed for tree plantation drive, during which fruit trees and medicinal plants were transplanted in the temple premises, gram panchayat office, school compound, by the roadside and near the primary health care centre.

Day four started with the cleaning of the playground and the premises of ZPHS so that the students could use it for playing. Under the "SWACH BHARAT" mission the students have actively participated in cleaning the roads, drainage and improved sanitation facilities.

On day five, the volunteers helped villagers to realize the benefits of internet and the services which can be made online for more secure and transparent transactions by explaining the concept of digitalization. The volunteers also presented a mime on helmet awareness and performed folk dances as part of creating awareness on these issues.

On day six an Eye camp and Dental camp were organized in association with Vasan Eye Care Hyderabad, headed by Dr. Prasanna Kumar with a team of six members where 100 villagers were treated and thirty members were relieved from tooth decay. NSS Unit of ATRI donated 25 pairs of spectacles to the needy. The day ended by enacting a skit on the problems of women and farmers' suicide.

JNTUH NSS Coordinator Dr. P. Sammulal visited the NSS camp of ATRI and appreciated the volunteers for their dedicated service and contribution. He also took part in the Eye camp. He was felicitated by NSS ATRI P. O Mr. D. Venugopal Reddy.

NSS special camp ended on day seven . A closing ceremony was held in which the work and efforts of all the volunteers in the camp was appreciated. Chief guests Sarpanch S.Malleshgoud, MPTC member Swapna and Govt school HM Jamadagni, school chairman Sridhar Reddy, Choutuppal ZPTC member Peddinti Butchi Reddy, ATRI NSS Programme officer D.Venugopal Reddy participated and expressed their wonderful ideas about the development of the village and the awareness created by the volunteers. Director Sri Srikanth Jatla addressed the gathering and told that out of the total number of accidental deaths, maximum victims are two wheelers(bikes). He suggested that everyone must wear a helmet and drive safely following the traffic rules. He appreciated the NSS team for performing this type of awareness programmes on campus.

National Girl Child Day



Every year, January 24th is celebrated as the National Girl Child Day to offer support and new opportunities to the girls and discourage sex selection. The day is also celebrated to increase awareness about inequalities faced by girls and women in terms of education, healthcare, nutrition, legal rights, protection, and honour. The initiative to celebrate National Girl Child Day was initiated by the Government of India as a development mission in the year 2009. Girls should be aware of legislations including Domestic Violence Act 2009, Prohibition of Child Marriage Act 2006 and Dowry Prohibition Act 2006 in order to get their proper rights and face all the challenges in life. The Right to Education Act has made available the free and necessary education to the girl child.

Inspiring Personality

Har Gobind Khorana (9 January 1922 – 9 November 2011) was a Punjabi American Biochemist. While on the faculty of the University of Wisconsin, he shared the 1968 Nobel Prize for Physiology or Medicine with Marshall W. Nirenberg and Robert W. Holley for research that showed the order of nucleotides in nucleic acids, which carry the genetic code of the cell and control the cell's synthesis of proteins. Khorana and Nirenberg were also awarded the Louisa Gross Horwitz Prize from Columbia University in the same year. Born in British India, Khorana served on the faculties of three universities in North America. He became a naturalized citizen of the United States in 1966 and received the National Medal of Science in 1987,Gairdner Foundation International Award 1980,Louisa Gross Horwitz Prize, Padma Vibhushan and Willard Gibbs Award in 1974.
