Annual Day AVYAYA 2016

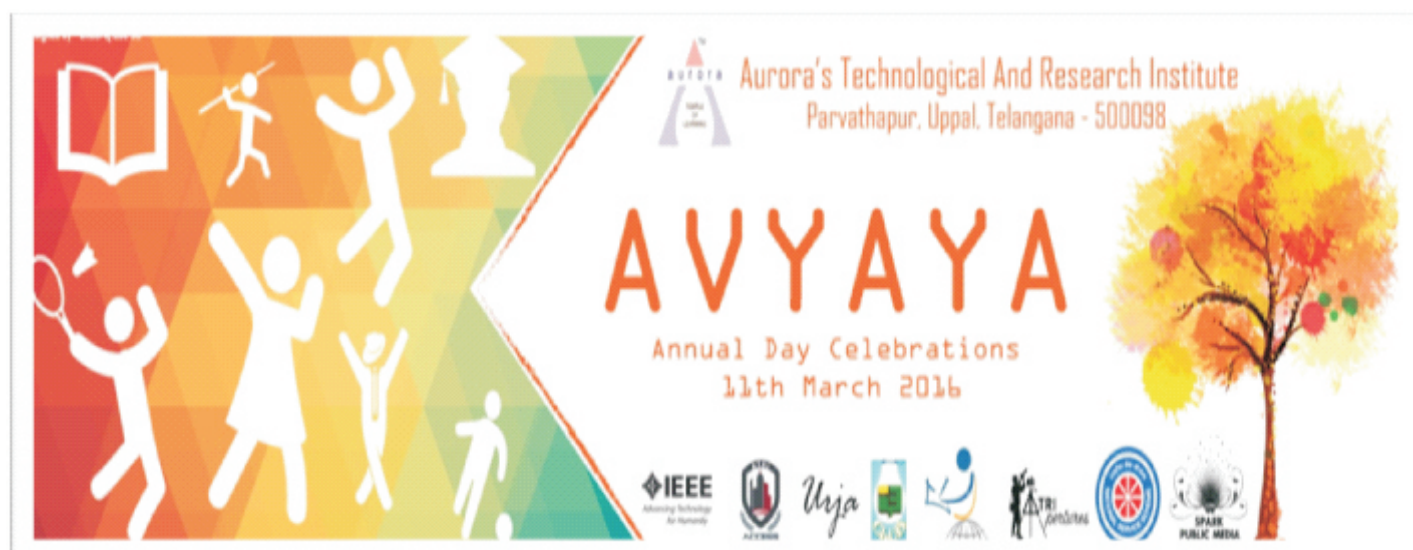
Annual day is celebrated every year at the close of the academic session. It provides an opportunity to the students to organize and participate actively in this mega event. The presentation of annual report of college activities is a special feature of the annual day function. Felicitation and distribution of certificates of merit in due acknowledgement to the students, faculty and staff of the college for their exemplary performance in different academic pursuits is an integral part of the programme.

ATRI has celebrated its annual day "Avyaya" on March 11th at Lal Bahadur Stadium, Basheerbagh, Hyderabad. 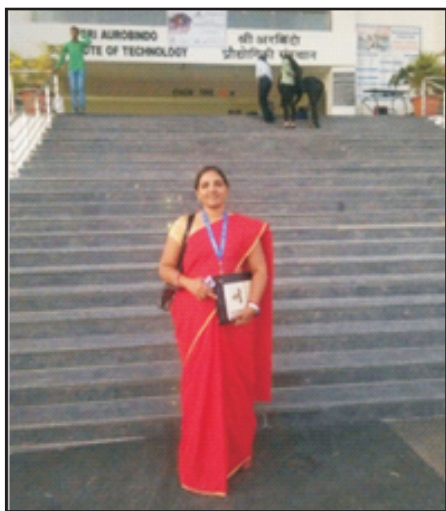

Mangte Chungneijang Mary Kom, born 1 March 1983, known simply as Mary Kom, is a boxer from the Sino-Tibetan speaking Kom tribe in Manipur, representing India. She is a five-time World Amateur Boxing champion, and the only woman boxer to have won a medal in each one of the six world championships. Nicknamed "Magnificent Mary", she is the only Indian woman boxer to have qualified for the 2012 Summer Olympics, London, competing in the flyweight (51 kg) category and winning the bronze medal. She has also been ranked as No. 4 AIBA World Women's Ranking Flyweight category. She became the first Indian woman boxer to get a Gold Medal in the Asian Games in 2014 in Incheon, South Korea. 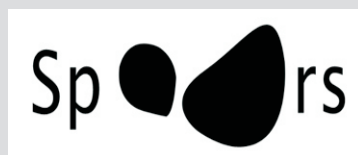


